Steeple Barton Decr 19 1823

By the first Page of this Book it appears that
in the year 1739 there were two sums of three Pounds
each belonging to the Poor of Steeple Barton; for
there is an account of the distribution of s6/. for the
Interest - After that followed an account of the
distribution of s12/. for 2 Years Interest - It
then mentions that William Boddington paid all the Interest
of three Pounds to May 1st 1739 - & that Robt Buswell
owed s12/. for 4 Year's Interest to the same date - It
wd appear therefore that there must at that time have been two
different sums - After that time only
one sum is mentioned - & the Interest is stated at s3/.
This sum is stated to have been paid from Year to Year
by one Overseer to the other; in the above Memorandum
of May 20 1787 Mr Brangwin says he paid it to
Mr Wm Gilks who succeeded him - Mr Gilks declared
that he never received it & as he soon after failed in in [sic]
business it has been entirely lost to the Parish.
The Commissioners appointed to enquire into the
employment of charitable Donations wrote to
the Minister & Churchwardens respecting it - But we had none of ever
[sic] heard of it before - We
however afterwards found this Book & as Mr Wm Gilks
is still living he gave us this explanation & Mr
Wm Forkner took it to the Commissioners this day
& they were satisfied
