When Thomas is 21 the farme and 12 yard land is bequeathed to him he paying out of the premises to said wife Mary the yearly sum of £20 to be paid quarterly

To my four daughters Martha Mary Elizabeth and Anne £100 each on respective ages of 21 years or days of marriage which shall first happen to be paid by son Thomas. If a daughter dies money to be shared between others
