following First I give devise and bequeath unto my

Barton in the county of Oxford carpenter the sum of  
two hundred pounds and after the death of my wife  
Sarah Haynes the further sum of fifty pounds to  
be paid unto him by my executors hereinafter named  
in manner following two hundred pounds at the  
expiration of twelve months after my decease and  
fifty pounds at the expiration of twelve months  
after the decease of my wife the said Sarah Haynes  
Also I give devise and bequeath unto my son  
Richard Haynes the sum of three hundred pounds  
and after the decease of my wife the said Sarah  
Haynes the further sum of fifty pounds to be paid  
unto him by my executors in such proportion  
and manner as I have appointed for the payment  
of the legacy of my son Portunam Haynes Also  
give devise and bequeath unto my daughter Mary

and manner as I have appointed for the payment  
of the legacy of my son Fortunam Haynes Also  
give devise and bequeath unto my daughter Mary  
Haynes the sum of two hundred pounds and after  
the decease of my wife the said Sarah Haynes the  
further sum of fifty pounds to be paid unto her by  
my executors in such proportion time and manner  
as I have appointed for the payment of the legacies  
of my aforesaid two sons Fortunam and Richard  
Haynes Also I give devise and bequeath unto my  
said daughter <sup>Mary Haynes</sup> the feather Bed, Bedsted and furniture  
to the same in the best bedroom Also I give devise  
and bequeath unto my wife Sarah Haynes and unto  
my son Joseph Haynes and unto my son John  
Haynes jointly all those my two freehold messuages  
tenements malthouse and premises situate lying and

being in the parish of Westcott Barton in the said  
county of Oxford and in the tenure and occupation of  
my son Fortunam Haynes carpenter and William  
Hedges labourer to have and to hold the two said messuage  
and tenements malthouse and premises to my said wife  
Sarah Haynes and to my said two sons Joseph Haynes  
and John Haynes their heirs and assigns forever And  
I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my said  
wife Sarah Haynes and my said two sons Joseph Haynes  
and John Haynes executrix and executors of this my last  
Will and Testament And finally as to all the rest residue  
and remainder of all my estate and effects real and personal  
whatsoever and wheresoever not hereinbefore effectually  
disposed of after payment of my debts funeral expences  
and legacies I give devise and bequeath the same  
unto my wife Sarah Haynes and my two sons the said  
Joseph Haynes and John Haynes my executrix and executors  
their executors administrators and assigns forever hereby  
revoking all former and other Wills and Testaments by  
me at any time heretofore made in witness whereof  
I have to this my last will and Testament set and  
subscribed my hand and seal this 8<sup>th</sup> day of May in  
the year of our Lord 1820.

Will of Richard Haynes Middle Barton Farmer and Maltster 8 MAY 182~~90~~

To son Fortunam WB Carpenter £200 and after the death of his wife Sarah the further sum of £50 £200 to be paid 12 months after his decease and £50 12 months after the death of his wife

To son Richard £300 and after the death of his wife a further £50

To daughter Mary Haynes £200 and after the death of his wife a further £50

Both to be paid in same way as money left to Fortunam

To his daughter Mary Haynes the Feather Bed, Bedsted and furniture to the same in the best bedroom

To wife Sarah and son Joseph and son John jointly his two freehold houses malthouse and premises in Westcott Barton in tenure and occupation of his son Fortunam carpenter and William Hedges labourer

His wife Sarah and sons Joseph and John to be Executrix and Executors

Residue and remainder to wife Sarah and sons Joseph and John
